My Brethren,

This article will deal with Masonic conduct, most specifically, the conduct of members while within the Lodge. The above quote is from Br. Joe Negron of Munn Lodge NYC, which was used as the source for this article. As a point of interest, his article was adapted from a paper titled *Standards of Masonic Conduct* prepared by the *Committee on Masonic Research and Education* of the Grand Lodge AF & AM of Minnesota.

This article discusses some traditions and ideals of Masonry and should in no way be read as a Masonic "do's and don'ts" list.

In our jurisdiction there is no dress code, but a man's outward appearance reflects his inner self, generally speaking, and specifically speaking, the respect he has for Masonry. Business attire is considered appropriate for most Lodge meetings. It is common, however, that at stated meeting members wear more business casual attire such as a polo shirt and khaki pants. This is not wrong, but it is not traditional. Many members are coming straight from work and have no time to change before Lodge. During degrees it is requested that formal wear be worn by all Brothers whenever possible. It is important to remember that your apparel should be appropriate for the occasion and those attending.

At Tyled meetings the sound of the gavel in the East brings the Lodge to order. The officers take their places or stations and all brethren are seated unless called upon by, or rising to address the Worshipful Master. Most speaking is directed to the East. It is improper for Brothers not to have private conversations during a discussion or while the Lodge is at labor. Discussing religious, political or other divisive topics is considered un-Masonic within Lodge. Always rise and salute the Worshipful Master when speaking, even if you are seconding a motion. When addressing (or referring), to a Brother it is proper to use their Masonic title such as Brother, Worshipful Brother, etc. followed by their last name. When entering or leaving a Lodge at labor, use the Tyler's door and a salute should be given from West side of the alter, not from your seat or the door, and directed to the Worshipful Master, or if he directs, to the Senior Warden.

Receiving degrees is one of the most meaningful and memorable events of a Mason's life. The excitement and fun of a degree is felt by all participants. But still, all too often we see this solemn experience defiled by laughter, inappropriate comments or even rude remarks. Consider the poor blind candidate and how he may perceive hearing laughter or discontent. We must impress upon him our trustworthiness and the seriousness of his undertaking. *"Nowhere does Masonry give any man license to take liberties with another."* Assertions that cause a candidate to have concern for his personal dignity or safety are the most disrespectful and also considered un-Masonic. The Grand Lodge of Arizona requires the following to be read at the beginning of the second section of the Master Mason degree:

"My Brethren:

A candidate is about to be raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason. The Lodge room will be used as a stage to enact a drama which, symbolically unfolds the great lesson of the immortality of the soul.

To properly impress the candidate with the seriousness of this ceremony, there must be no talking, whispering, laughing or other commotion during the conferring of the degree. Bear in mind the fact the Temple, for this portion of the degree, is supposed to be silent and unoccupied.

Only the participants in the drama are to speak, and they are instructed to make no facial expressions, gestures or other unusual deliveries which might induce levity. The cooperation of each one here present is EXPECTED.

An adherence to these instructions will help serve as an impressive climax to the candidate's progress in Freemasonry and this section of the degrees could well be one of the richest experiences of his life."

This essence of this statement is true for all degree work. The one interruption that is usually accompanied by the best of intentions is prompting. This should be done by the person the Worshipful Master has designated and no one else. It is confusing to try and repeat an obligation when three or more brothers saying it. Remember, degree work is for the candidate. It is not just another meeting or a social gathering. It must be treated with due reverence.

When visiting another Lodge, especially in another jurisdiction, it is important to remember that although the principles of Masonry are universal, Masonic laws and traditions will differ from place to place. In almost all cases (I'm hard pressed to think of any exceptions), you must conform to the customs of the Masonic Jurisdiction in which you are traveling.

It all comes down to respect. If you have respect for your Brethren; for the Lodge; for the institution of Masonry itself; and most importantly for yourself, you will find harmony in our society.

In closing, I'd like to leave you with another quote:

"These are the standards of Masonry. It is not easy to apply them to ourselves. But then, being a master of any craft is never easy, and being the Master of oneself is perhaps the most difficult of all."

My Sixty-Year Masonic Anniversary for Ken Skoog at Arcana Lodge #187

Over sixty years ago that I had been working with the General Mills, Inc. Mechanical Division on Central Avenue NE, Minneapolis. I had started work with the Quality Control Department and was made foreman at the time. During the time that I had roamed through the different departments that were involved my inspection work crews. I periodically took notice of certain people reading little black booklets. Those type of situations were noted during company breaks and at break or lunch times.

As time went by my curiosity got the best of me and I started making some inquiries with some of those individuals as to why they were reading those little black booklets together. They appeared to be quite secretive as to why they were doing those reviews and then I decided to per-sue it a bit more thoroughly. I asked if it would be worth my while to take interest in what they were doing. I gathered that I should find out by filling out a petition and I was presented with one. It proved to be Masonic, and the nearest lodge happened to be located on Central Avenue NE or Arcana Lodge # 187.

The Mason's as I had previously heard, were a good strong God fearing organization and so I proceeded to fill in the petition and presented it back to the person who gave it to me. Thus I had petitioned Arcana Lodge # 187 and was later accepted to start my degree work under the direction of Mr. Floyd Pike who was the Lodge Master at that time. I had learned that after I decided to join, that there were several other persons at (GMI) or General Mills who were also involved in preparing for the same degree work. at 'Arcana'. At least I didn't feel alone in pursuit of a Master Mason Degree

I took my 'Entered Apprentice Degree' on May 31, 1951, the 'Fellowcraft Degree' on June 13, 1951 and 'Master Mason Degree' on June 27, 1951. I was proud of this great accomplishment and proved up at a later date in a class of 8 or 10 other men. I was happy to have received my 50-year pin during the year 2001 and now this is 60 years.

All in all, I have enjoyed this great fellowship during all of those years and was glad to have been accepted as a Master Mason. God Bless!

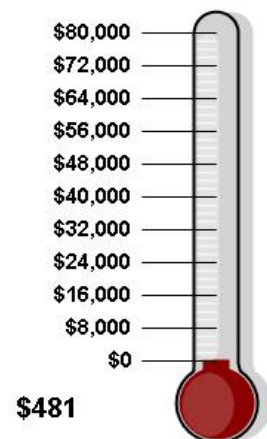
Goal of raising \$80,000 to Repair Our Elevator
